A set of four William V silver entrée dishes

A set of four William V silver entrée dishes, John Edward Terry, London, 1835, shaped rectangular, the detachable covers engraved with a coat of arms and a crest, cast acanthus screw-off handles, 31.5cm long, 274oz (4)

The arms are possibly those of Drill/Driley/Dryle or D'eyville.

Condition Report

Fully marked on the body, cover and handles. The arms on the tureens are not listed in Papworth but the closest match is Drill/Driley/Dryle or D'eyville. In order to make the arms on the tureens into those listed the background needs to be changed from argent (silver) to Or (gold) and the 3 flowers on the central area to the same charges as the three surrounding flowers. The flowers on the central area look like lilies and the fleur-de-lys is thought to represent the lily. This is, however, not a strong attribution.
